Facilitated IEP Meetings & Mediation

What can I do if I disagree with my IEP team?

Parents and IEP teams do not always agree on what is best for a child. Sometimes the "tone" of the meetings becomes uncomfortable which interferes with team members working together successfully. If this persists, it may be helpful to involve a neutral third party in the process.

As a parent, you may request to have a Facilitated IEP Meeting. The entire team participates in a facilitated IEP meeting and emphasis is placed on showing the team how a meeting can be conducted in a productive and positive manner. During a facilitated IEP meeting, a facilitator may:

- □ Assist in allowing members to voice their questions and concerns
- □ Encourage active listening
- \Box Help keep the team focused
- □ Write information on a flip chart
- □ Guide the team through problemsolving

In Delaware, a parent or school can request to have a Facilitated IEP Meeting or Mediation by contacting the DE Dept. of Education at (302) 735-4210 or <u>http://www.doe.k12.de.us/</u> When a parent and IEP team cannot agree on an issue that they have been trying to resolve, it may be helpful to request Mediation. This is a more formal method used to resolve disagreements. Unlike a facilitated IEP meeting, not all IEP team members participate in mediation and the meeting will be held in a neutral location. A parent may bring one or two persons of their choice and a school must ensure that a person attends who has authority to make decisions and commit to resources. During mediation, a trained mediator serves as a neutral third party and helps both parties to:

- \Box Clarify issues
- □ *Recognize differences in a more collaborative way*
- \Box Find agreeable solutions

Mediation is:

- □ Voluntary
- \Box Free of charge

If a formal agreement is reached during Mediation, the agreement is legally binding and must be implemented by the school.
